TRAUB

The new piece will be brown. It will be a mountain. It will be a solo. The space will be brown, a bent-backed mountain in its back, the floor brown, and the walls as well. The space will know how to transform, it will have gentle movement, it will change slowly. The performers will be dressed in brown as if created from it. The shades of brown will indicate the humidity levels and heaviness of the mass, the temperature and time of day, whether subterranean or aboveground.

The Work will include four dancers rotating solos between them, and six string-instrumentalists, who will be the landscape of the work, will sit and stand alternately in a row at the back of the space as a horizon. They will play unceasing music, creating a space to stare at and gravitate towards. One whose highs come in rising and falling waves. Dictating, to a large extent, the mindset, the pulse, and the temperature of the movement on stage. The music will be characterized by self-repeating loops of overwhelming circularity. As the mountain slowly changes and

accumulates, so will the music without us noticing.

Unlike my previous work, in which three moving bodies shared the stage with one playing body, in the Mountain the players will be the pack and the moving body will be the single. Joining them. The solo, thus far magnified, as mentioned, by the use of multiple performers, will stand on its own. Unison and repetitiveness, tools which I use often, will manifest themselves in a different way this time. The solo of one body will join the synchronized melodies of the band harmoniously, sometimes merging with the ongoing musical loop.

This time, it will be the loneliness of the body in opposition to a group of musicians. The solitary body will change; four dancers will substitute one another and will take each other's place. Each for a solo. One will continue the other or transpose their movement, take their shift, share the burden. Movement will be impacted by words: mountain, lookout, peak, edge,

slope, vastness, mass, frost, wind. Sometimes the solo will be of space itself, moving on its own through sets and lights. In each moment, one element will bear the courage of loneliness. Solo by solo, image by image, mountains will try to move slowly, without us noticing they will change.






Left: Brown Mountain preparation sketch for "Mountain" (preformance), 2022, 42X30 cm, ink on paper


Giant preparation sketch for "Mountain" (preformance), 2021, 42X30 cm, oil pastel on paper.











"Trees warp time" writes the British author John Fowles in his poetic essay "The Tree", when describing how he feels as soon as he enters "one of the countless secret little woods" where he lives, almost like "leaving land to go into water, another medium, another dimension". The same feeling applies to spectating Nina Traub's new extraordinary work "Faintings", which begins with a beautiful Mise-en-scène: at the center of the large stage is a smaller, round, stage and in its heart a minimalistic wooden sculpture, resembling a weeping willow, whose naked branches canopies Zoe Polansky that sits in their shadow surrounded by musical instruments. The entire back wall is an acrylic painting on paper, huge in its dimensions, and in it more and more jets of green branches are bursting, slanting downwards, bending with tears.

Faintings, it seems, does lead to a temporal blackout, for as I have finished watching the performance, I felt as if awakening from a daydream, from a sweet-disturbing stroll through a thick brush of sublime thoughts and images.

Faintings offers an instructive multi-sensual experience: of visuals, of music, of movement. The choreography, dense and delightfully simple, is treated with an in-depth interpretation and wonderful execution by the dancers; Their chantings curtained by Polansky's guitar; their movement wanders the thick green volume of the stage, and without noticing, the spectator is sucked into an elusive adventure in time, surprisingly ending with the sound of their choky wailings, testaments to the ongoing battle between the wild and the tamed, from which originates any work of art.











The short film Hive is a collaboration between three artists, who were quarantined in the artist residence facility of Cité Internationale des Arts in Paris during the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak. The lockdown imposed by French law has led to the emergence of a variety of restrictions which are the basis of this ongoing project.

Yet, Hive does thematize the situation in Paris metaphorically at most.

The psychological journey of the protagonist speaks of the world beyond the confinement: stipulations of social roles, productivity, nationality are invisible walls that will not leave with the quarantine prescribed by law. We are involuntarily born into social schemes that we voluntarily appropriate. And yet we live in the name of and praise individual freedom.





Our body is part of the landscape in which it exists. Basic simple movement, absorbed in the movement of nature, creating weather, creating temperature.

We know how to be human and animalistic, to manage in solitude or in a pack, to be nature, to be landscape. To linger: To go and come back.

It is a specific world with density, time and color and can be observed with intensity and sensitivity, which are one. The inner need for precision, order and repetition for making sure and relief, creates a work, which is all about the longing to come out to the open, where there is wind. To dare embark on a journey and to not be afraid. To go on.

This work explores a body-landscape relationship. How the basic unassuming movement is so simple and assimilated to be creating nature, creating climate, radiating temperature. The search for refuge, for rest, is omnipresent, and the goal this work seeks to achieve.





The work is a collaboration with the two artists - Noam Alon and Clemens Turpe who live in Paris. It was created for Danse Élargie 2018, and performed at the Theater de la Ville in Paris. Due to the geographical distance between us, the work was formed from our meetings on Skype and some intensive work sessions in Paris and Tel Aviv.

Our esthetic language is questioning the matter of scale - we are trying to create a compatibility between our bodies and the real space that we are inside it. This compatibility summons the sublime - the "not being here". This merge between the body and the space, and the use of basic colors - is asking to almost delete us - to free us from being functional. All that brings us closer to our heterotopia - in which we are "just" a part of the landscape.



Text written by Amit Drori, Art Director of Hazira Performance Art Arena In twilights, dread sprouts out of the dusk.

The color is the place. Screen of light and warmth. Inside of it, natural powers and textures: light, temperatures, Subterranea. The search after an origin to movement travels through words and climates and is a catalyzer for simultaneous action and repetition. A process of accumulation, different forms of intensiveness and a joint endeavor to refine movement in order to precise feelings. The desire to be in one thing gives birth to a uniform stubborn physicality. The cold movement coexists with the warmth of the struggling body and balances.

Where the Sun Sets is an ascetic quiet duet. From the gentle connection between visuality and

physicality a total-stage-world. The execution reflects the methodical work process, in which the physicality - made of rules, structure and order - is streaped, deconstructed and practiced in an extended research process.

The choreography is embedded deeply, the images and the performers' execution blend into one.










